We desire to bring the gospel to the last unevangelized people groups of the world with the end goal of establishing thriving churches.

THE NEED

More than 6,000 of the world's people groups remain unreached. They have no access to the Bible, no local church and no missionary to share God's word in their heart language. Ethnos 360 currently works in over 30 countries where this is a reality.

OUR STRATEGY

Effective engagement at a deep worldview level begins with the acquisition of the culture and heart language. After years of study, we translate and teach the Bible faithfully from creation to Christ as we seek to make disciples and established thriving churches that are self-sustaining, self-governing and self-propagating.

Sent from churches like yours, thousands of **Ethnos360** missionaries have worked since 1942 to establish thriving churches among people groups who are **unreached** with the Gospel and **unengaged** by the global Church (UUPG). They have engaged 438, translating the Bible's NT (with OT portions) into 92 with 105 in progress.

Thousands more language groups still have nothing of God's word and no way to learn about Jesus. Until He comes, would you like to help tell the untold people about Jesus Christ?

A bit about Ethnos360...

Entire language groups of people have no way to learn about Jesus. Sent by their local churches as missionaries, Ethnos360 teams work together to establish **thriving churches** among them.

Founded in 1942 as New Tribes Mission, Ethnos360 was organized to assist local churches with sending missionaries to people groups "where no witness of the Gospel has yet reached." They focus on the least-reached people groups, or ethnolinguistic people groups unreached with the Gospel and unengaged by the global church. (UUPG)

Marathon missions. Sent from churches in 36 countries, the missionaries and global partners of Ethnos360 have worked with 438 people groups in 34 countries to establish thriving churches. Translating the Bible has often been a prerequisite to teaching it.

Being there. Learning an unwritten language involves life-on-life relationships with the people who speak it. To faithfully communicate God's message, missionaries need a high level of language fluency. Once fluent, missionaries create an alphabet, develop literacy, translate the Bible, and teach. Discipleship continues toward establishing Biblically qualified leaders.

Equipping. Believers need God's word in their hands to trust God's word, grow to maturity, and minister to other people. Then they will be able to teach the Bible from beginning to end, laying foundations for Christ-centered faith. They will be able to train Biblically qualified leaders to teach others also, and send laborers.

Ethnos360 Training gives students two years of tutelage under experienced missionaries. They learn about Bible translation, church planting, cross-cultural communication, literacy development, orthography, linguistics, animism, & world religions. They gain experience in remote living, navigation, travel logistics, food planning, building houses, electrical systems, plumbing, and missionary medicine. Daily life overseas may involve child

education, small engine repair, team relations, and conflict resolution. Instructors encourage a close walk with God.

Ethnos360 Bible Institute. Prerequisite to Ethnos360 Training, career missionary candidates must have a working knowledge of the scriptures. Ethnos360 Bible Institute is a two-year program, online or in person, designed to prepare people for ministry.

Method

We minister among unreached people groups:

In 2,500 of the world's 6,500 people groups, there is no church, nor is there any work being done to establish a church. These are the people among whom Ethnos360 works.

We work in the tribal culture and language:

These people groups' cultures and languages have isolated them from the Gospel. Missionaries must learn their language and understand their culture in order to clearly present the Gospel and effectively plant a church.

We present foundational Bible teaching:

Unreached people groups have no concept of the God of the Bible. So, Bible teaching begins at the same place God began with His chosen people: at the beginning. Chronological Bible teaching presents a foundation for understanding Jesus' death and resurrection.

We establish maturing churches:

Following the pattern seen in Acts as God's people carried out the Great Commission, missionaries seek to establish mature churches that can take their rightful place as agents of change in their own communities and partners in the Great Commission.

INTRODUCTION: The Wayumi Course is a week-long college level course for individuals interested in an in-depth exposure to all that is involved in tribal missions and Church Planting! Some Bible Colleges give credit to students who complete the course.

DESCRIPTION: The Wayumi Course attempts to:

- Introduce the student to the biblical basis for reaching unreached people groups with the Gospel
 of the Lord Jesus.
- Expose the student to the primary challenges of cross-cultural Church Planting, i.e. Language and Culture Acquisition, Animism, Bible Translation, teaching God's Word cross-culturally, principles for establishing the Church, and principles for seeing the Church truly become indigenous.
- Exposes students to various support ministries necessary to accomplish the task of Church Planting amongst unreached people groups; ministries such as aviation, MK Education, Medical Ministry, etc.

What does a missionary need to know to plant thriving churches among ethnolinguistic people groups where Christ is unknown?

Maybe we should start with the desired result: Thriving churches.

In those places where Christ is unknown, we would like to see thriving churches of Christ-followers, rooted in their identity in Christ, seeing themselves as part of His global Body, led by Biblically qualified leaders, glorifying God in the way they live, practically applying God's word to their daily lives, exercising faith in God's word as they are reaching out to the lost, and intentionally preparing people through discipleship to be sent to proclaim the glory of Christ where He is yet unknown. Working back...

- How do we ordain church leaders?
- What is a thriving church?
- When is the church planting complete?
- What does the local church need to know?
- How do we teach people to know and love the God of the Bible?
- How do we prepare Bible lessons that lead to maturing believers?
- How do we know people understood what has been taught?
- Since the Bible does not yet exist in that language, how do we translate the Bible?
- Who checks for Bible translation accuracy and how?
- How do we create an alphabet for an unwritten language?
- How do we introduce God to people who know nothing of Him?
- How do we develop literacy programs to teach people to read?
- How do we learn an unwritten language?
- What are common cultural obstacles that have derailed ministries?

- What are the logistics of living in remote places?
- What are the best options for educating missionary children?
- How do we handle medical emergencies when professional help is far away?
- What are the logistics of maintaining a consistent food supply?
- What are the options for transiting terrain that is dangerous?
- What does it take to build a house safely in a remote location?
- How do we find clean water for a family to drink?
- What are healthy ways to manage waste?
- How do we design and maintain electrical systems to keep our translation and printing equipment functioning?
- How do we survive extreme heat, cold, humidity, or arid climates?
- How do we maintain good working relationships with family and coworkers in high stress environments?
- What are the practical realities and disciplines needed to maintain a close walk with God in remote isolation?
- How do we handle finances when banks are logistically distant?
- Where do we find logistical and technical assistance when things don't go well?
- What is the government red tape that must be addressed to travel internationally and live among remote people groups?
- What are the security issues and contingencies that missionaries frequently face in ministry?

The thing about learning is that we do not know what we do not know until someone tells us. Often, we are the last to know when there is something we need to know. Two ways to learn are: from "the school of hard knocks" (experience) or from someone who has already been there.

The advantage of a missionary training is that we can tap into the vast experience of global Christians over many years to avoid what seem to be obvious obstacles to the informed. Awareness helps us to succeed.

The task of glorifying God through planting churches is an impossible task apart from God intervening and transforming lives. Walking by faith, trusting in His word, any obstacle to proclaiming His glory can and will be overcome. Our daily challenge is to humbly submit ourselves to His Word, to His Spirit, and to keep learning from His servants. Training helps.

Status of the Nations (Ethnos)

Among 8 billion people there are 12,148 people groups, or ethnolinguistic groups with a common self-identity. "For strategic purposes a people group is the largest group within which the Gospel can spread without encountering barriers of understanding or acceptance.

7,282 people groups have insufficient witness from the global Church to engage the people group with church planting.

3,191 of these people groups are unengaged by the global Church.

WHAT IS A PEOPLE GROUP

An ethno-linguistic group with a common self-identity that is shared by the various members. For strategic purposes it is the largest group within which the Gospel can spread without encountering barriers of understanding or acceptance.



WHY ARE THEY UNREACHED?

A people group is considered unreached (UPG) when there is no indigenous community of believing Christians able to engage this people group with church planting. Technically speaking, the percentage of evangelical Christians in this people group is less than 2 percent.



WHO ARE THE UNENGAGED

Unreached people groups are unengaged (UUPG) when there is no church planting strategy, consistent with evangelical faith and practice, under way. Gathering believers and planting churches are the keys to establishing an effective and multiplying presence among these people groups.

To whom will we give the Bible?

The Bible was given to us at great cost.

- What if no one cared to translate the Bible into English? Where would we be? These people cared:
- John Wycliffe 1380 AD Translated handwritten manuscripts of the Bible in Middle English to make it available in that language.
- Jon Hus 1415 AD Hus promoted Wycliffe's ideas of Biblical literacy in the common language. He was burned at the stake with fire kindled using Wycliffe's manuscript Bibles.
- **John Gutenberg 1450's AD** John invented the printing press to publish Bibles. He lost everything to partners, but his press changed the world.
- John Colet 1496 Colet translated New Testament portions into English for his London college students, then the public. Twenty thousand people gathered to hear public readings at St. Paul's Cathedral. He was protected from execution by powerful friends.
- William Tyndale 1536 AD Tyndale printed the New Testament in English. He is known as the "Architect of the English Language." He was strangled and burned at the stake in 1536 AD. As he died, He prayed, "Lord, open the king of England's eyes." Three years later the king authorized the Coverdale Bible. *

- Miles Coverdale Finished translating the Old Testament and printed the first complete Bible in English in 1535. "Coverdale Bible"
- **Thomas Cranmer** In 1539 published "The Great Bible", the first Bible authorized by the king. Cranmer was burned at the stake in 1555 AD by Queen Mary I.
- John "Thomas Matthew" Rogers 1555 AD The Matthew's Bible was the first complete English translation from the original Hebrew and Greek which was published in 1537 Thomas Matthew was a name used by both Tyndale and Rogers lest their own names hinder the sale and distribution. He refused a pardon contingent on recanting His beliefs and was burned at the stake February 4, 1555.

Have you taken the time to consider what God has done through the investments of these people in the English language?

Until Christ takes us to be with Him, we have the privilege and responsibility to invest in those language groups where Christ still unknown.

There are about 1268* languages plus dialects that need a Bible translation to communicate God's word.

To translate the Bible in each language may require an investment of ten missionary families, each with about one hundred supporters, over about twenty years.

The objective would be to establish thriving churches that truly glorify God with the whole Bible in their hands that they can read and share with other people.



Church Planting Process

Where people have no access to the Gospel.

Getting There – Many ethnolinguistic people groups are unreached by the global church because of where they live. Missionary work is about going to where they live, crossing oceans, continents, rivers, jungles, and mountains to teach God's word so that they may live eternally.

Being There – A key part of teaching people to obey all that Christ commanded is being close enough to live life with them day by day, overcoming logistics, to learn how people think and to show how God's word is applicable. Ministry happens in the context of relationships.

Culture & Language – Unwritten languages are learned from people who trust you enough to teach you. God's word is the most important message. Teaching all of it requires a high level of fluency. Culture is the meaning behind the words people use to communicate ideas.

Bible Translation – People need access to what God has said. It is His message that transforms lives. Faith must be built on God's word. This is what people will apply to their own lives and share. For faith, growth, & outreach, people need God's word in their hands.

Foundational Bible Teaching – Eternal life is to know God. His own revelation of His identity and character begins in Genesis. We want to follow Biblical patterns of revealing His person, purpose, plan, people, and processes, teaching God's word from beginning to end.

Disciples – Placing resources in the hands of people as we teach enables them to immediately establish patterns of teaching others. In time, faithful people will stand out who can be set apart for leading. All willing people can be equipped to obey God's word and share it.

Leadership – We want to establish thriving churches that are led by Biblically qualified local leaders who will join us as partners in ministry to reach every ethnolinguistic people group with the Good News about Jesus Christ. Commit to faithful men who will teach others.

Logistics of Church Planting

If you live near the ends of the earth, it really helps to use an aircraft to get there. Most of the other infrastructure of civilization is missing, too. That's where **Support Missionaries** can really help the Church Planting effort. Each Skilled Worker accelerates the success of the team toward establishing thriving churches. Accounting


Money is the transfer of work. Missionaries must leave their ministry to go to where transactions can be made unless someone can do this for them.



The Scriptures are full of vision and purpose, requiring faith in God. As ambassadors of Christ, it is our privilege to pass on God's word to other believers may see God's glory and the imperative of making Him known. Through knowing Him, abiding in Him, and obeying Him, they can join us in accomplishing God's purpose for us.

God gave very specific instructions and patterns for the building of the Tabernacle. Willing-hearted people responded by faith in obedience to the commands according to very specific patterns by the gifting and empowering of the Holy Spirit. (Exodus 35:21-22)

Will God build His church without planning, patterns, and empowering the willing-hearted? (Rm. 12:1-2) Will people respond as ambassadors without the clear call of God to the willing-hearted to build according to His pattern? (1 Cor. 3:10-15)

Teaching (Mt. 28:20) could be about replacing false ideas with God's thoughts about reality. Our minds need to be renewed about God, ourselves, other people, our values, and our role in the world.

Foundational Bible Teaching is about replacing false worldviews with the framework, context, stories, character, and relationships as God has revealed them to mankind historically. It's about being transformed by the renewing of our minds through careful building.

How can a person think correctly about God if that person knows nothing about Him? We come to know Him through His written Word.

A name, with the information that gives a name meaning, reveals to us the character and context associated with the name. *

In our day, many people have no information or false information in their memories associated with the names, Jehovah, God, Lord, Messiah, and Jesus Christ. It is through the revelation of the Holy Bible that those names take on character and meaning that is true. The Biblical information reveals to us the relevance of those names to our daily lives and eternal future.

Our work as ambassadors is to relay accurate information to the people with whom we interact, so that they can believe the correct things, make informed decisions, and know the consequences of their choices and actions. Jesus directed all of us to the Scriptures.

More than that, it is our responsibility to lead people to obey Jesus; to enter a dynamic relationship of knowing & believing His word. Mt. 28.

The commitment to establishing thriving churches has driven many missionary teams to evaluate past work, and, in quite a few places, to go back to the beginning; to start over with teaching from the beginning in the heart language using Foundational Bible Teaching.

If we are in too big of a hurry to teach people in their own language to know and love God with all of their heart, soul, mind, and strength, then what is it that we are really delivering to them?

For whom and what would they labor? In the manner of our Savior, let's prepare people for the joy set before them by leading them to fellowship with our Savior, showing them God's purpose, and equipping them for ministry that results in heavenly treasure.

Laying Foundations for Knowing God

People seem to have a lot of knowledge about God; but do they know Him? Have we shown them His glory?

"And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent." John 17:3

We can give people a lot of information about God without ever walking with them through His word to show them His identity, character, and purpose. While information about Him is vital, people need to know God as the hero of the story of His glory.

Discipleship is about walking with people through life, teaching people to obey Jesus. We can teach people what to do without leading them into a relationship with God that shows them why.

It is easy to make assumptions about what people know, based on casual interaction, knowledge of their history with other believers, or their ability to use spiritual jargon. We dare not build on those assumptions about a person's faith.

We must check the foundations by teaching people of God's person, purpose, plan, people, and processes. Then they will be equipped to lead others to know Him and walk with Him.

There is only one object of faith that can save our souls. Other objects such as a prayer, an action, church attendance, good deeds, and righteous living cannot help people when they meet Jesus Christ. Only faith in Christ as our crucified, resurrected, omnipotent Creator & Redeemer can save any of us eternally.

God delivered the knowledge of Himself over history in a pattern of progressive revelation. His pattern is a wise and fruitful one to follow. The free resource at this link expounds on why we should lay careful foundations. (1 Cor. 3:10) See bit.ly/boff-why

people I journey with want desperately to know that story.

BACKSTORY

Empowering a disciple-making movement

Indigenous believers in Papua New Guinea revised the foundational approach that brought them to faith to meet needs within their context. As a result, truth had a greater impact, and

after two years of discipling, they planted a church on their own. All this equipping took place at a grass roots level, from within their church.



Fast forward to 2015. When Norm McCallum, a Christian Woodland Cree Elder from Saskatchewan, heard about this strategic approach, he asked us to bring it to Canada. His reason?



He exclaimed, "What we're doing isn't working!"

Since then, Canadian Indigenous and non-indigenous believers have been adapting this approach for their own context — resulting in what we call *Establish*. *Establish* is a foundational disciple-making series that begins in Genesis and ends in Revelation. It provides a step-by-step journey in disciple-making to establish ALL people in Christ and empower them to make disciples.





The Call

Many people seem to be waiting for "The Call" before they engage in major life changes to serve the Lord where the needs are greatest.

What is enough to move our feet toward faith in action, if not the written word of our Creator?

On the highest authority in heaven and on earth, Jesus commanded His disciples to go to people in every ethnic group to preach, baptize, and teach obedience to all that He commanded. (Matthew 28:16-20, Mark 16:15, Luke 24:46-48, John 20:21, Acts 1:8, Romans 10:13-17, 2 Cor. 4 & 5)

Through His word, God calls people to come to the Lord Jesus Christ, to repent, to be holy, to abide in Him, and to bear much fruit to the glory of the Father. As we draw close to Him, certainly we will be drawn to His heart for people in all of the world. (John 15:16, 2 Peter 1:3-11) So, "The Call" is not as much about whether or not we should be active in faith but where and when we will serve Him in ministering to other people.

Sometimes God directs people to a specific purpose in a particular location, for a time. God frequently moves people overseas who are already very active in serving Him where they are. Almost always, over a lifetime, you will find those ministers active in many other places in addition to the place of their "calling". Nearly all the Apostles ended their lives serving in other countries. Did they not set the example for the rest of us?

My intent here is to encourage people to take action on what God has already written by faith and in fellowship with their local church.

While we serve Him, God will open our eyes to needs in the world around us and show us where our individual skills may benefit the Body as Christ builds His Church. He will also direct us through the local churches and



leadership where we are already engaged in ministry, so begin by working together with the Body of Christ where He has placed you – while keeping the whole world in mind. (Acts 17:26, Ephesians 1:4, 2:10)

Ministry vs Missions?

"Missions" is outreach where the Church does not exist.

Some call it "global outreach."

Many Christians seem to confuse the ministry of the Church with the mission of the Church. Missions and ministry are complementary, but ministry can occur without accomplishing God's mission of preaching the Gospel where Christ is unknown. We can heal the sick, dig wells, and care for orphans without ever once communicating the Gospel of God's grace through Jesus Christ.

Wherever a community of Christ-followers seek to glorify God there will be the ministry of the Church. People will be working to care for the widows and orphans, to help the poor, to heal the sick, to reach out to people in prison, to stand as salt and light in the world, to evangelize the lost, to disciple believers, to equip the saints for ministry, to prepare people to lead according to Biblical qualifications, and to send messengers to people where Christ is unknown. Where the Church exists, outreach is ministry.

Ministry glorifying God is not happening where the Church has not reached. One third of the people on earth have **no access** to the Gospel.

Have you attended "missions" conferences where the global mission of the Church is lost among many displays of local Church ministries? *

Is God's global intent ambiguous in Matthew 28:18-20, Mark 13:10, 16:15, Luke 24:46-48, Acts 1:8, 13:47, Romans 10:13-17, 1 Corinthians 15:34, and 2 Corinthians chapters 4 & 5?

The Great Commission is primarily about going where the Church has not yet reached to preach, baptize, and teach.

By going where the Church has not reached and teaching people to obey all that Christ commanded, we will establish communities of Christ-followers as outposts of ministry and mission to proclaim the glory of God beyond the edge of the global Church.

How are we preparing each other to accomplish God's mission?

- Are we spending time communicating the glory of God, the enemy's role in hiding God's glory, or the role of believers in revealing God's glory?
- Are we talking about places where God's glory is hidden?
- Are we teaching how a local church prepares and sends laborers to the ends of the earth as ambassadors?
- Are we discipling children to proclaim God's glory?
- Are we teaching about the work of sending and supporting global church planters?
- Do we know the end objective in sending missionaries?
- Do we talk about how we will know when we will have completed the missionary task that we have set out to accomplish?

Ministry is the Body of Christ working to glorify God in the world through evangelism, discipleship, and outreach.

Missions involves establishing ministry where the Church has not reached by establishing Christ-followers and teaching obedience.

The Church works together as a Body, under Christ as the head, to proclaim God's glory throughout the whole world by evangelism, discipleship, equipping, sending, and sustaining fellow laborers until there are thriving communities of witnesses in every language and ethnicity.

In those places where Christ is still unknown, we would like to see thriving churches of Christ-followers, rooted in their identity in Christ, seeing themselves as part of His global Body, led by Biblically qualified leaders, glorifying God in the way they live, practically applying God's word to their daily lives, exercising faith in God's word as they are reaching out to the lost, and intentionally preparing people through discipleship to be sent to proclaim the glory of Christ where He is yet unknown. (stilluntold.org/basis)

Urgency

"He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God." - John 3:18

If people hear about Jesus and reject Him, that's their business.

If people have never heard about Jesus, telling them is our business.

People all over the world are dying completely unreached by Christians. As were we, they are condemned by their sin to eternal separation from God in the lake of fire. Here's the difference:

Someone told us about Jesus, and we believed.

No one has told them.

By His grace, God has made available, by His Word and through His Church, the message of His forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ.

"... I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some." - 1 Cor. 9:22b

Only this generation of Christians can share the Good News about Jesus Christ with this generation of people. Limited by time, we have an opportunity to invite people, as many as we will, to believe God.

"For the love of Christ constraineth us..." 2 Corinthians 5:14a

We can do nothing about the people who have already passed into eternity. When we die, we will be unable to act in leading people to know God. While we live, we can intervene for some by sharing Christ.

"And that he died for all, that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again."

- 2 Corinthians 5:15

We have the privilege and responsibility to act on behalf of others.

"Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God."

- 2 Corinthians 5:20

Urgency

What happens to people who have not heard of Jesus?

All people measured against God's glory fall short. -- Rom. 3:23

Trusting in the name of Jesus Christ is the only way to be saved from God's wrath. -- Acts 4:12, John 3:36, 1 John 5:12

The lake of fire is the ultimate destination of people whose names are not written in the Lamb's book of life. – Rev. 20:15, 21:27

What does the enemy seek to hide from people?

In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them. – 2 Cor. 4:4

What was Isaiah's response to seeing God's glory?

Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I; send me.

-- Isaiah 6:3-8

What is God's means of delivering His message to the world?

Faith comes by hearing the word of God which is spoken by messengers who are sent. -- Romans 10:13-17

We are God's ambassadors carrying the message of reconciliation in the ministry of reconciliation as though God were beseeching the world through us to be reconciled to God.

-- 2 Corinthians 5:18-20

-- 2 Corinthians 5:18-20

Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid. – Matthew 5:14, 1 Thess. 5:5

What do we have to share with other people?

The treasure in our earthen vessels is the light of the knowledge of the **glory** of God in the face of Jesus Christ. -- <u>2 Cor. 4:6-7</u>

Why Missions?

Why actively engage in God's mission to tell everyone on earth about Him?

- Because God is worthy to be acclaimed by every people group of every ethnicity in every language in every part of the world.
- Because God has a very good plan that He wants everyone in the world to hear about and willingly embrace.

The why of missions is that there are thousands of unique language groups of people who have not yet been told about God's very good identity, interest, intentions, and intervention. They have no access to God's written word, the witness of the redeemed or the community of the Church. Jesus told us to go everywhere and tell everyone what He has done. His love for us and them compels us.

How can people believe God if they have not been told about Him?

God wrote a book, "The Holy Bible", the unique book, so that all people may know Him and share their knowledge of Him with other people. His primary means of communicating the greatest message is through people who have been told being the messengers to tell the people who have not yet heard.

God's mission since creation includes filling the earth with people who believe Him; willing-hearted people who acknowledge His greatness, love His goodness, reflect His worth, revel in His glory, and relate well with others who share Him as their greatest treasure.

God's clearly stated objective for each person is to know and experience the grandeur of His unending goodness and fellowship for all of eternity. He provided only one way to solve the problem of our lack of goodness and give us perfect righteousness: through believing Him – trusting in the gift of eternal life which was purchased by Jesus Christ.

A prerequisite to pleasing God is believing Him. <u>Hebrews 11:6</u> A prerequisite to believing God is hearing His Word. This requires someone to speak His Word, and people who will send someone to speak His Word. <u>Romans 10:13-17</u> From beginning to end, the Bible communicates God's mission for mankind. God's mission is the reason the Church is still on earth: to draw every willing person into a personal relationship with Him.

"Missions" is about the Church discovering and engaging in God's mission, giving access to His message. So, **Why Missions?**

God's identity – <u>Job 38</u>, <u>Isaiah 40</u> – As the all-powerful God who spoke everything into existence, stretched out the heavens and laid the foundations of the earth, God, our Designer, Creator, and Owner, possesses the right, the power, the authority, and the expectation that His creation and His created beings should function within His designed purpose and plan. He is worthy. Knowing His identity is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's character – Exodus 34:5-10 – God is good. His goodness, lovingkindness, mercy, righteousness, justice, and grace demand that we be like Him and extend His goodness to all people everywhere. That which is not good must be judged and punished as a necessary part of His goodness. In His goodness He has paid the penalty through Christ and given the keys to His kingdom to His ambassadors, who have been commanded to tell everyone. Embracing the goodness of His character is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's glory – <u>Habakkuk 2:14</u>, <u>Isaiah 42:8</u>, <u>Psalm 67</u> – God will make His glory known and not share it.

God's plan – <u>1Timothy 2:3-4</u> – Since before Creation God has planned to fill the earth with people who believe Him. His plan has not been thwarted and will be accomplished. (Genesis <u>1:28</u>, <u>6:13</u>, <u>9:1</u>) We are part of His plan and that is reason enough to willingly engage in His mission.

God's purpose – God's purpose was and is that all people should know Him, walk with Him, and reflect to Him the glory that is due to Him. Walking with Him includes living with Him in right relationship, in fellowship, in joyous harmony, and with all people through trusting in the finished work of Christ. His designed purpose, His glory, is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's Word – <u>Isaiah 55:11</u> – What God has said will actually happen. He has shown us that people from every tongue, language, tribe, nation, people group, and ethnic group will be among those <u>redeemed</u> by the blood of the Lamb. He has told us what happened in the past, has given us everything we need to live in the present, and revealed enough of His plan to fully enter into it with confidence. His Word is reliable. His Word is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's method – Romans 10:13-17 – God's usual means of communication throughout human history has been through those who have come to know Him telling those who have not heard; so that they may believe, trust and obey Him. God's usual method of delivering His message is through a personal courier. Us. See 2 Corinthians 3, 4, & 5. 2Corinthians 5:18-20 His method is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's heart – <u>2 Peter 3:9</u> – He is not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

<u>Psalm 67</u> His heart for us and others is reason enough to fully engage in His mission.

God's command – <u>1 Corinthians 15:34</u> "Awake to righteousness, and sin not; for some have not the knowledge of God: I speak this to your shame." His command is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's commission – <u>Mark 16:15</u> – Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature. His commission is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's kingdom – <u>Matthew 24:14</u> – This topic of the kingdom was so important that after His resurrection Jesus appeared to His disciples again and again for the next forty days to reassure them that He really is alive and that they really caught what was on His heart: The Kingdom. <u>Acts 1:3</u>. Wouldn't it be nice to know what He told them? We do know! They wrote books! And they told other people who wrote books: Matthew, John, Peter, James, Jude, Mark, Luke, and Paul. – His kingdom is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's rewards – <u>Matthew 6:20</u> – The heavenly layaway plan. Lay up treasure for yourselves in heaven. Good deeds and other people are all that we can take with us. Heavenly treasures are reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's priorities – <u>Matthew 6:33</u> – Some things are more important than others. Jesus told His disciples to seek God's kingdom first. God's priorities are reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's accountability -2 Cor. 5:10-11 - We will each give an account of what we have done. Revelation 20:11-15. "Knowing therefore the terror of the Lord, we persuade men..." Our day of accountability, and theirs, are reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's wrath – Romans 1:18 – Every person should seek to avoid God's wrath and live in such a way as to help others avoid God's wrath by believing Him. – See $\underline{\text{Hebrews 10}}$. God's wrath is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's grace – <u>Ephesians 2:8-9</u> – God's unmerited favor is a gift. It is beneficial to anyone who receives it. We received it because someone else cared to tell us about Him. The grace we have received is ours to share. We are God's delivery service. God's grace is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's mercy – <u>Titus</u> 3:4-5 – Because He has been merciful to us, we should extend His mercy to others. God extended His mercy to us through someone who told us about Him. Through our faith and obedience, He will extend it through us to others. God's mercy is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's love – 2 Corinthians 5:14-15 – The love of Christ compels us. – God's love compels us that we should no longer live for ourselves but for Him. God's love for the world, God's love for us, our love for God, and God's love through us to the world are reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's preparation – <u>Ephesians 2:10</u> – God has prepared good works in advance for us to do. – God's preparations are reason enough to engage in His mission and those good works.

God's promise to Abraham – Genesis 12:3 – Through Abraham all the families of the earth will be blessed. He was blessed to be a blessing. His promise to Abraham, fulfilled in Christ and extended through us to every family, is reason enough to engage in His mission.

God's Abrahamic promise through the Church – Galatians 3:7-9 – By faith (in God), we are the spiritual seed of Abraham. In Christ alone all the families of the earth are and will be blessed. We are blessed to be a blessing just as Abraham was. By means of the proclamation of His glory through believers, the spiritual seed of Abraham, all of the families of the earth are to be blessed. We are blessed to engage in God's mission.

Christ's suffering – Galatians 2:20, Matthew 16:24, Luke 9:23, Colossians 1:24, Philippians 3:10, Luke 14-27. Christ's sufferings are offered in person to those for whom Christ died through the sacrificial living, word, and testimony of those who have believed already. Christ's suffering for us is reason enough to suffer for His sake to proclaim Him to others as part of His mission.

God's Son's Identity – The identity of Jesus is the cornerstone of our mission. As the Creator of all, He has a design and a plan for each person He has created. Each person has great value and purpose. He has revealed His plan in His written word and purchased the pardon for sin for each person with His own blood. His heirs, his brethren, His friends, His ambassadors have great opportunity to represent Him well to the world. Colossians 1:13-24

God's Son told us to <u>love God</u> with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength. Doing that requires that we adopt His values regarding people.

Plus, God's Son, without whom was not anything made that was <u>made</u>, gave His disciples very specific instructions:

God's Son told us to <u>love our neighbors</u> as ourselves. How can we love them without telling them about Him?

God's Son told His disciples to <u>lift up their eyes</u> and <u>look at the fields</u> because they are ready for harvest.

God's Son told His followers to <u>pray for laborers</u>... just before He <u>sent</u> those same prayer warriors to go to work in those fields.

God's Son said, "As the father has sent me, so send I you." <u>John 20:21</u> And that was after He told them that they were the <u>light</u> of the world and have the keys to the Kingdom.

Why Missions? Because the word of God that He has already spoken is enough information for any living person to act with complete abandon toward obedience. He has already given us everything that we need for a grand entrance. (2 Peter 1:3-10) No more revelation is needed or necessary. What will we do with what we know?

Trusting God

Some of the first things I hear from people who are considering a career in missionary work are, "How do I pay for it?" "Will we get paid?" "Do I have to ask other people for money?"

"...You cannot serve God and money." Luke 16:13

When considering our obedience to God's commands, each one of us will have to decide whether or not God is trustworthy.

"While I go to the ends of the earth to preach, baptize, and teach as He commanded, can I trust the provision of my daily needs to the God who created me?

"Can I trust my safety to the hands of the God who created all of those scary, unfamiliar people, animals, and crawling things? Will I die if people don't give?

"What did Jesus mean, "Take no thought for tomorrow?" and "he who saves his life shall lose it." Are we really to be as lilies and sparrows in trusting God's care?

"Can the God who created the lions, tigers, snakes, and spiders protect me from them while I go where these creatures live to do what God has commanded?"

Many people answer, "No." But some say, "Yes!" So, I am asking in search of some more "Yes!" people.

Will you trust God to provide for you, based on His written word, and act by faith?

Many of us missionaries have found Him faithful. Will you?

The transfer of work.

Potential missionaries are often afraid that they might have to ask someone for money. Yet those same people will have no problem asking for donations or even physical help when a fire burns a house in the neighborhood. That is noble!

What is the difference? The difference is the focus of attention. Who is the beneficiary, the victim, or the rescuer? Is helping people escape a burning house more noble than helping people escape a burning eternity?

Beliefs inform values. Informed people should act. Lives must be saved. People must be warned by those who see the need, even at great personal cost.

Money is how we move work. Whether or not you invite help, the timely work of telling unreached people groups about Jesus Christ will not be accomplished without a team of individuals using their gifts, working together as a Body. When there is no coercion and God's Spirit is leading the response, inviting people to engage is noble.

Some people work at home and send funds abroad so that missionaries can hire local workers. Some realize that there are necessary skills that cannot be hired, so they give their lives to serve overseas in support of the church-planting missionaries. Church planters live in remote places to teach God's word, disciple people, and translate the Bible to establish churches.

Career rescuers need help and provision beyond their personal means to accomplish their tasks. Giving their lives, while trusting God to provide through His people to accomplish His work, is noble. 1 Cor. 12

Giving /Stewardship

"Our budget is full." "We cannot support any more missionaries."

These are often the first thoughts expressed in churches when I tell people that I am a visiting mission mobilizer. It's as if the primary thing in missions is funding for ministry. Churches seem to be overwhelmed with missions coming in from outside rather than going out from within.

The reality is that money, as the transfer of work, is a huge part of missions. God has designed ministry in such a way that the Body cannot accomplish His objectives unless all work together under the direction of the Head. We all need active faith to glorify God in His work.

Knowing the needs precedes giving to meet them. However, if we use high pressure tactics to squeeze a few bucks out of someone, does that glorify God? Is that willing-hearted generous giving that is prompted by the Holy Spirit to apply God's word by faith and glorify the Father?

While we have a responsibility to include the members of the Body by sharing needs and opportunities, we should share in such a way as to allow the Holy Spirit to move hearts in His timing.

There are many ways to engage in proclaiming God's glory to the ends of the earth. Entrusting some of the rewards of our hard work into the hands of faithful people so that they can hire workers in another country is one honorable way to engage.

Knowing, or inquiring, about how a steward will use what is given is a responsibility of all of us who give. With that in mind, this page is

Culture and Mission

Culture is the environment in which the words, sentences, and paragraphs of languages have meaning. Language is the spoken expression of a people's culture. Culture is the story behind the people.

Culture is what determines the way you think, act, and feel.

Culture tells you when you should be happy, sad, joyful, angry, indignant, or protective. Culture is a person's accumulation of assumptions about reality that are derived from observations, family practices, peer pressure, personal desires, historical experience, and teaching. A person's perception of acceptable and unacceptable behavior is determined by culture.

Words have no meaning without sentences. Sentences have no meaning without context. The primary context of any ethnolinguistic people group is the culture in which they live.

Culture includes things known to everyone in the culture that people rarely talk about.

Culture includes common assumptions about reality. Our culture helps us understand the meaning in context.

For example, the word "present," depending on the context in which it is used, could mean an object such as a gift, a speech that is being given, or a period of time meaning now. The word "bark" could mean the sound of a dog, the rebuke of a person, or the skin of a tree.

Since we are communicating God's message, we need to be careful to relay what He intended.
Culture is a key to communicating accurately and effectively.

What does culture have to do with church planting?

Faithfully communicating God's word requires us to know the culture that shapes what our audience will understand; the context in which a particular word or idea will be understood.

Without the understanding of local culture, Bible teachers will assume that listeners share the presenter's own context and culture that shape the meaning of the words used. The listener will use his or her own imagination and experience to give words meaning within the context of his or her own culture. Bible teaching with unresolved culture barriers usually result in a works-based syncretism rather than a Christ-centered faith.



Where Christian ideas have been communicated without the presenters taking the time to understand the language and the culture, there will often be "Christianized" people who sing recognizable Christian songs and speak Bible words... without understanding the Biblical concepts conveyed by the words.

The words of a language have no meaning without culture. Behavior and motives can be judged negative by cultural references, blocking peaceful, and effective communication. Nonverbal communication across cultures can prevent an audience from hearing words.

We are ambassadors for Christ. Our work is to tell people what God has said in a way that communicates His meaning in the cultural contexts of our audiences.

The excellent goodness of God's written word informs, shapes, and corrects cultures. God's word shows us how we should think, act, and feel about the things that happen in the world around us, even within our own unique cultural heritage.

Heart Language & Culture

To establish a thriving church, people must have the written word of God in their hands in a language they understand.

We want to establish churches of people who are equipped to apply God's word to their daily lives, who are led by Biblically qualified leaders, and who are reaching out to the world around them using God's written word.

It is God's word that we share with one another and our neighbors.

Literacy in Church Planting

Bible translation requires readers.

Being able to read God's word as it is presented helps the learner build confidence in God's message as He gave it.

Literacy gives a person the power to fuel him or herself with information from God on a daily basis that will be used in that person's life by the Holy Spirit to guide and direct that person into

good relationships and behaviors. (2 Timothy 2:15)

Literate Christians are able to obediently apply God's word to their own lives as they act in faith to share it with other people.
